3. This approach relies on partnerships between service providers, ensuring that people receive the right care in the right place at the right time.
4. It puts less reliance on the hospital as the "default" place to receive care, and more emphasis on community-based services.
5. The Health Links and Integrated Comprehensive Care pilot projects currently underway at HHS and throughout our LHIN are good examples of population health approaches.
6. A population health approach can help address barriers to care that exist for vulnerable and marginalized populations.
7. We think the population health approach will help address some of Hamilton's big health challenges, such as large variances across the city in the rate of multiple, chronic conditions, late-stage cancer diagnoses, low birthweight babies, earlier incidence of heart disease and a lower life expectancy.
8. We will proactively identify populations of people at risk and work with community-based organizations to design care models tailored to their needs, enabled by both the resources and expertise of HHS and our partners.
9. Developing our data analytics capacity is an important part of being able to identify people and populations at risk.
